MINUTES OF THE 131st MEETING OF EMPOWERED COMMITTEE UNDER MULTI-SECTORAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME HELD ON 27.07.2017 UNDER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF SECRETARY, MINISTRY OF MINORITY AFFAIRS.

The 131st Meeting of the Empowered Committee (EC) for Multi-sectoral Development Programme (MsDP) was held on 27.07.2017, under the Chairmanship of Secretary, Ministry of Minority Affairs to consider and approve the project proposals with regard to the Minority Concentration Blocks/Towns received from State Governments of Manipur, Telangana, Sikkim, Tripura, Karnataka, Maharashtra and Uttar Pradesh. The representatives of the Ministry of Drinking Water & Sanitation, Ministry of WCD, NAWADCO, Ministry of Human Resources Development and NITI Aayog were present during the meeting. The Pr. Secretary to Govt. of Uttar Pradesh, Director, Govt. of Karnataka and an officer of Govt. of Telangana were present during the meeting in person. The Pr. Secretary, Govt. to Telangana, Secretary, Govt. of Sikkim, and representative of Maharashtra and Tripura also attended the meeting through video-conferencing. The Joint Secretary & Financial Advisor of the Ministry was also present during the meeting.

- 2. Progress on website: The progress of implementation of MsDP is reported on quarterly basis to the Delivery Monitoring Unit (DMU) in PMO (Prime Minister's Office) and the status of implementation of various projects in terms of funds released by the Ministry of Minority Affairs and utilized by the State/UT; number of works sanctioned, completed and works in progress is regularly monitored. These details of works are placed in the Ministry's website for transparency. State Governments/UT Administrations are required to review the implementation on quarterly basis; ensure that Central funds are released to the districts within one month of sanction; State share (wherever applicable) released along with the Central funds; ensure that the executing agencies start the construction works at the earliest, and complete the construction works within the scheduled period.
- 3. Adhering to guidelines and eliminating duplication: States/UTs should ensure that the proposals sent have the approval of the State Level Committee of MsDP / Mission Director of CSS concerned in order to ensure that the proposal, in terms of specification, norms, standards etc., is in accordance with the guidelines of the scheme concerned and that duplication has been ruled out. The responsibility for eliminating duplication of work and avoiding double counting of a scheme under two

funding sources vested with both the district authority and the State Government. Accounts under MsDP should be maintained separately and Central Ministry concerned informed of assets created in respect of CSS topped up under MsDP.

- 4. The States/UTs were advised by the Empowered Committee to ensure that the catchment area of the assets created under MsDP have substantial minority population. Further the States/UTs would also ensure that the ownership of the asset created would be with the Govt/Govt body.
- 5. Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS) guidelines: MsDP provides that there would be no change in guidelines of any existing Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS) under implementation in such districts for which this programme would provide additional funds. In case schemes for individual benefits are taken up under the programme, there shall be no divergence from existing norms for selection of beneficiaries from the list of BPL families in the district, so that benefits from the additional funds flow to all BPL families and not selectively. However, the provision under Indira Awas Yojana (IAY) guidelines for making separate allocation for Scheduled Castes (SC) or Scheduled Tribes (ST) will not be followed under MsDP. The entire number of units sanctioned under MsDP would be given to BPL households, from minority communities as well as other communities, in order of the serial number in the approved wait list without making separate allocation for Scheduled Castes (SC) or Scheduled Tribes (ST).
- 6. <u>Timely release of funds</u>: The sanction letters of the Ministry stipulate that funds should be released to the district/implementing agency within a month's time, but the States/UT have been generally taking much time in releasing funds to the district/implementing agency. State shares, wherever applicable, are not released along with the Central funds by some States. Prompt release of funds was advised to ensure that works are started at the earliest.
- 7. <u>Utilization Certificate:</u> For release of second installment, utilization certificate (UC) is required. If the UC is furnished within a period of one year after release by the Ministry, 60% UC would be required for releasing the next installment. However, if utilization is made beyond the period of a year, 100% utilization would be necessary. The UCs would need to be accompanied by QPR showing physical progress as proof of the work in progress. The Utilization Certificates of the 2nd and subsequent installment should also be submitted by the States/UTs to the Ministry.
- 8. <u>Sample testing and quality control:</u>Quality control was to be ensured through regular and frequent field visits and by testing samples of the construction work for which funds would be sanctioned by the Ministry on receipt of request from the State

concerned. All the States/UTs were advised to carry out field visits, quality control tests and review all works under MsDP to ensure that the shortcomings do not take place in their State/UT.

- 9. Inclusion of Members of Parliament in State and district level committees: Members of Parliament (MP) and Member of Legislative Assembly (MLAs) have been included in the State and district level committees for implementation of the Prime Minister's New 15 Point Programme for the Welfare of Minorities which also serves as the committee for MsDP. MLAs are also to be nominated on the Committees by the State Government. It should be ensured that they are invited to attend the meetings of the district and State level committees.
- 10. **Display boards:** Para 16.1(ii) of the scheme of MsDP provides for a 'display board' which should have– Name of the project/scheme printed followed by "Multisectoral Development Programme (MsDP), Ministry of Minority Affairs, Govt. of India." For projects with longer construction period, in addition to above, the name of implementing agency, date of sanction of the project, likely date of completion and estimated cost of the project should be printed on the display boards. States/UT should ensure this and put up a permanent display on completion of each project.
- 11. General conditions applicable to projects approved by the Empowered Committee for approvals given by the Empowered Committee, including in-principle approvals, the Principal Secretary/Secretary of State's/UTs and the District Collectors/representatives were advised to note that the following conditions would apply to all projects under MsDP. State Government/UT administration concerned should ensure that the following have been complied with:-

Approval of the State department concerned/Mission Director for Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS) concerned have covered the following –

- (a) Need for having the proposal sanctioned under MsDP.
- (b) Duplication has been eliminated.
- (c) Proposal is as per norms, specifications, layout design, funding norms and cost norms of the CSS guidelines concerned.
- (d) Separate accounts for schemes under MsDP will be maintained and details sent to the Central Ministry concerned for maintaining proper record of assets and avoiding double counting and duplication.

- (e) Estimates have been prepared as per Schedule of Rates (SOR) of the State Government and have been approved by a competent engineering department of the State Govt.
- (f) Staff is available for functioning unit or will be provided for new unit.
- (g) Recurring expenditure would be provided by the State Government.
- (h) Land is available and/or will be made available by the State Government in villages/locations having the highest proportion (percentage) of minority population.
- 12. Review meetings of Oversight committee in State and district level committees: The scheme of MsDP envisages quarterly review meetings by the State and district level committees for implementation of the Prime Minister's New 15 Point Programme for the Welfare of Minorities which also serves as the review committees for MsDP. The State level committee also acts as the Oversight Committee for MsDP. Quarterly review meetings for State level committee/State Oversight Committee and district level Committee should be held and copy of the meeting notice should be sent to the Ministry to enable a representative to attend State Level meetings as envisaged under MsDP. It should be ensured that Members of Parliament nominated in such Committees are invited to attend the meetings.
- 13. <u>Photographs:</u>Photographs of completed works and works in progress indicating type of asset, name of location/village and date should be sent by email toshubhendu.ss@nic.in.
- 14. <u>Provision of toilets and bathrooms</u>: The EC emphasized that there should be adequate number of toilets and bathrooms and provision of water in the proposed projects.
- 15. The Chairman (EC) emphasized that the benefits accrued by the implementation of MsDP should go to the Minority Communities properly. Therefore, not only location of the assets in the areas having substantial minority population is important, but it is also equally important to see that the assets created are actually imparting benefits to the minorities. The State Governments were impressed upon to propose the locations of projects under MsDP accordingly.

4. Minh

Rs. 3.99 crore pending with State Government in respect of 11th Plan period. He further stated that most of the units sanctioned during 12th Plan are also nearing completion and all necessary steps for earlier completion of pending work are being taken.

The Chairman, EC desired that photographs of the asset so far completed and their status regarding commissioning may be sent to the Ministry at the earliest. He further added that the State should ensure timely submission of Quarterly Progress Report(QPR) and pending UC. On receipt of assurance from the representative of the State Government of Karnataka, the Empowered Committee decided to consider the projects submitted by the State for approval.

2. CONSIDERATION/APPROVAL OF FRESH PROJECTS FOR MCBs/MCTs:-

The State Govt. of Karnataka has submitted project proposals in respect Minority Concentration Blocks/Towns of 06 districts alongwith following declaration in appendix-II of guidelines of MsDP:-

- (i). The cost estimates proposed for the different works/projects are as per the standardized cost derived on the basis of norms/design prescribed by the concerned Ministry for that particular work.
- (ii).It has been ensured that all the school where ACRs, Labs and Hostels are proposed have at least 25 % enrolment of the minority students.
- (iii).It has been **ensured that there is no duplication of the work** with any scheme of the Central Government or a State Government and the concerned Director/Mission Director has been consulted in this regard.
- (iv). The land for all construction activities is available.
- (v). The maintenance and the recurring cost related to the assets proposed in this plan will be borne by the State Govt.
- (vi). The Plan proposal has been recommended by the State Level Committee for PM's New 15 Point Programme.

The details of project discussed by the EC are as follows:-

(i) Construction of Sadbhav Mandap: The State Govt. has submitted the proposal of construction of 04 unit of Sadbhav Mandaps. The EC noted that a Sadbhav Mandap was already sanctioned for Bidar and Chittapur. The

- rate sanctioned for a unit of Sadbhav Mandap was Rs.120 lakh. The EC further observed that only one unit of Sadbhav Mandap may be sanctioned for one MCB/MCT. Considering this, the EC agreed for one unit of Sadbhav Mandap at the cost of Rs.120 lakh for Jamakhandi Town on the same layout & design as approved by 127th EC.
- (ii) Construction of Navodya Model Residential School at Raichur and Kalburgi District at the cost of 2500.00 lakh: The state government has proposed construction of Navodaya Model Residential School on-lines of Navodaya run by the Directorate of Minorities at Raichur and Kalburgi District. The EC has already approved this project in Koppal and Haveri district in 120th EC at the rate of Rs. 1800.00 Lakh. The EC agreed to the project at the unit cost of Rs. 1800.00 lakh
- (iii) Construction of Morraji Desai Residential School at Raichur Town and Morraji Desai Residential PU College at Sidhanoor Town in Raichur District: The state government has proposed construction of Morraji Desai residential school Morraji Desai Residential U College at Rachichur Town and Sidhanoor Town of Raichur district. The EC agreed to the project at the same cost and layout/estimate as approved by Empowered Committee in its 127th meeting i.e. Rs.713.25 lakh per unit.

The EC decided to approve the following projects and the EC also decided to release the $1^{\rm st}$ installment of maximum upto 50% of the Central share for implementation of the projects.

The EC desired that the State Govt. should furnish full and comprehensive details of status of the projects approved in 11th & 12th plan including the timelines for completion of projects and photographs of the projects so far completed. On the assurance of the representative of State of Maharashtra that they will submit a detailed information on each and every projects under MsDP to the Ministry, the EC considered the proposal of Govt. of Maharashtra for construction of 100 bedded Boys hostel building for minorities in Buldana Block.

2. CONSIDERATION/APPROVAL OF FRESH PROJECTS FOR MCBs/MCTs:-

The State informed that the land for construction is available in an ITI premises. The State also submitted the other necessary declaration as per Appendix-II of the guidelines on MsDP. The estimate for the project submitted by the State was examined by the EC in consultation with representative of NAWADCO and it was observed that the cost of the project is at higher side. The State representive informed the EC that asset is proposed for an ITI which is having enrolment of 2484 students, out of which 474 are minorities. The proposed hostel will also cater the need of students of other colleges in nearby area. Considering the cost aspect, the EC advised the State to rework the cost estimate and bring it to EC for consideration.

C. TRIPURA

EC instructed the State Govt. to furnish full and comprehensive details of each project approved in 12th plan stating the expected timelines for completion of projects and also photographs of the projects.

2. CONSIDERATION/APPROVAL OF FRESH PROJECTS FOR MCBs/MCTs:-

Govt. of Tripura submitted proposals for water related projects including Sinking DTW, MDTW and surface water treatment plant. The EC directed the State Government to submit the cost abstract and DPR of the projects.

D. SIKKIM

1. REVIEW OF THE STATUS OF PROJECTS APPROVED:-

Review on implementation of projects approved for Govt. of Sikkim in 11th and 12th plan was taken up. It was informed by the State representatives that the Polytechnic sanctioned during 2014-15 will be completed by March, 2018. The Secretary directed the State Govt to submit the UC for release of 2nd instalment by Oct, 2017.

2. CONSIDERATION/APPROVAL OF FRESH PROJECTS FOR MCBs/MCTs:-

After a comprehensive review of the projects so far sanctioned for Sikkim, the EC considered the following proposals of Sikkim for Mangan and Chungthang Blocks of North District:

 Construction of 50 bedded Girls Hostel at Govt Sec School, Gor: The State representative informed that the hostel is to be constructed in a Govt. co-ed school (from class 1-10) where there is an enrolment of 168 students. It was also informed that teachers are available and the asset will benefit students from

surrounding 10-12 villages. The engineering cell of the Minority dept. will implement the project.

- 2. Construction of 50 bedded Girls Hostel at Govt. Sec School, Phodong: The State representative informed that the hostel is to be constructed in a Govt. coed school(from class 1-12) where there is an enrolment of 250 students. It was also informed that teachers are available and the asset will benefit students from surrounding 10-12 villages. The engineering cell of the Minority dept. will implement the project.
- Construction of 8 room school building cum science lab at Govt Sec School, Mangan: The State representative informed that the school has been upgraded to higher secondary school (till class 12) and there is an enrolment of about 900 students. The additional rooms are required for this upgradation.
- Construction of 2 ACR at Govt JH School, Pakshep: The State representative
 informed that the school has an enrolment of 120 students and currently has 4
 classrooms. It is a middle school from class 1-8.
- Construction of 50 bedded Girls Hostel at GovtJHS, Naga: The State representative informed that the school has an enrolment of 122 students. It is a middle school from class 1-8. The asset will benefit students of surrounding 15 villages.

The EC observed that the other projects related to re-construction of PHC, construction of quarters in PHSC, additional class rooms in schools which is yet to be upgraded and in school with religious affiliation do not fall in the priority items of MsDP.

The EC approved the following projects and also agreed to release 50% of the central share as $1^{\rm st}$ instalment:-

Govt. of Manipur submitted proposals for implementing Cybergram in 7 districts of the State. The proposal was not considered as no representative was available during the meeting. The Chairman, Empowered Committee also observed that individual beneficiary oriented schemes may not be given priority under the Scheme and also opined that the same may be discontinued in proposed restructuring of the programme.

It was informed by the State representatives that the delay in implementation of projects is due to the bifurcation of Andhra and Telanga in 2013-14 and further agitation that ensued. The representatives informed that the State will start all works by Oct, 2017 and complete by March 2018. The Chairman, Empowered Committee directed the representative of State of Telangalan to expedite the submission of Utilisation Certificate and Quarterly Progress Report (in the prescribed format) for release of 2nd instalment by Oct, 2017. The Principal Secretary, Telangana assured the Empowered Committee for early submission of these documents.

2. CONSIDERATION/APPROVAL OF FRESH PROJECTS FOR MCBs/MCTs:-

After the review and assurance of State of Telangana, the Empowered Committee considered the proposal of the State for construction of 17 Minority Residential Schools in 17 locations, 11 Sadbhavna Mandaps and other projects related to AWC, health, etc. However, considering the tentative allocation made under MsDP for the State, it was agreed to approve 6 Minority Residential Schools for a unit cost of Rs. 18.00 crores.

The Chairman, Empowered Committee discussed the slow utiliastion of funds by the Uttar Pradesh and also non completion of projects sanctioned by Ministry even during 11th Five Year Plan period. The Principal Secretary, Government of Uttar Pradesh informed the Empowered Committee that the Government of Uttar Pradesh is reviewing the status of all projects of MsDP and all efforts will be made by them for completion of all pending projects. She also stated that the state will ensure the submission of Utilisation Certificates for atleast 54 unit of schools building by April, 2018 and construction work for atleast 31 GICs will be completed in 2017-18. The Chairperson desired that once the State update its record they may submit the status report so that the Ministry may reconcile its records with States'

2. CONSIDERATION/APPROVAL OF FRESH PROJECTS FOR MCBs/MCTs:-

The Government of Uttar Pradesh vide their D.O. letters dated 27.06.2017 & 19.05.2017 has informed the Ministry that during 11th & 12th Plan period, the Ministry has approved different nos. of Schools in identified Minority Concentration Areas. Amongst the approved schools it has been informed by the State that the structure for around 120 schools have been completed/being completed. Under the MsDP, the provisions for furniture & equipment for these schools was not included in the sanction.

The State Government informed the Empowered Committee that since these schools lack furniture & equipment, the infrastructure built under MsDP could not be used and requested this Ministry for sanctioning of furniture and equipment items for these 120 schools at the unit cost of Rs. 27.30 lakh.
- The State vide their D.O. No. 1904/52-1-2017 dated July, 2017 submitted a list
 of location of schools (district wise & EC wise) and requested for approval of a
 uniform cost for each school.
- 4. The Chairman, Empowered Committee, reviewed the Status of these projects and with consultation & consent of Pr. Secretary, Uttar Pradesh agreed for sanctioning of funds for procurement of furniture for only those schools where construction of building has been complete.
