**Subject: Grant in aid under the Centrally Sponsored Scheme of Multi sectoral Development Programme for minorities to Government of West Bengal for the year 2009-10 for Uttar Dinajpur District.**

Sir,

I am directed to convey the sanction of the President for release of an amount of **Rs. 9,10,88,000/- (Rupees nine crore ten lakh eighty eight thousand only)** as 1<sup>st</sup> instalment (50% of total central share) of the total sanctioned amount of **Rs. 18,21,75,000/- (Rupees eighteen crore twenty one lakh seventy five thousand only)** for the year 2009-10 to the Govt. of West Bengal for implementing the scheme "Multi Sectoral Development Programme for minorities" for Uttar Dinajpur district as per the details enclosed at Annexure. The non-recurring grant may be released to the Govt. of West Bengal through CAS, Reserve Bank of India, Nagpur.

2. The expenditure is debitable to Demand No.66, Ministry of Minority Affairs Major Head- "3601" Grant-in-aid to State Government, 04- Grants for Central Plan Scheme (Sub Major Head), 378 -General- (Welfare of Schedule Casts/Schedule Tribes and Other Backward Classes) -other grants, 04 - Multi sectoral Development Programme for minorities, 04.00.31 - Grant-in-aid for the year 2009-10.

3. Utilization Certificate for this grant should be submitted by the grantee in the prescribed format within 12 months of the date of the Sanction Order.

4. The State Government should ensure that a board containing information of the date of sanction of the project, likely date of completion, estimated cost of the project, source of funding i.e. MsDP (Government of India), contractor(s) name and the physical target is displayed. After completion of projects, a permanent display would be installed.

5. This sanction issues with concurrence of IFD vide their Dy. No. 451/AS & FA (MA) dated 17.09.2009. It is noted at S.No. 23 in the Grant-in-aid Register.

**Upgradation of High Schools:**

- (i) The State Government has to ensure that the schools would be constructed in villages having the highest proportion of minority population.
- (ii) A list of villages would be provided. It would also ensure that the cost for the construction of ACRs was approved by the State PWD.
- (iii) To prevent duplication, the State Government should ensure that the ACRs funded under MsDP were reflected in the State Action Plan of the scheme concerned and information also sent to the Ministry of Human Resource Development.

**Indira Awas Yojana (IAY):**

- (i) The State Government would ensure that the IAY houses would be constructed in villages having the highest proportion of minority population, and BPL families would be selected from the approved waiting list, even if they belonged to communities other than the minority communities, strictly in order of their ranking in the list as per the IAY guidelines.
- (ii) It was stressed that no deviation from the guidelines was permitted.
- (iii) The list of the villages having the highest proportion of minority population along with the number of houses to be constructed would be provided. State share would be provided.

**Construction of anganwadi centres:**

- (i) The centres would be constructed as per the design, specification and norms of the M/o Women and Child Development and centres would have a kitchen, store room, toilet and playing space and in addition a crèche/day care centre.
- (ii) The centres located in villages which have the highest proportion of minority population would be selected.
- (iii) To prevent duplication and for ensuing maintenance of a consolidated data base the State Govt. should send the list of anganwadi centres constructed with MsDP funds to the Ministry of Women & Child Development.
- (iv) The social welfare department in the State should be involved in all stages of implementation.

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
